Alli's Birth Story: Postpartum Hemorrhage

Definitions of Terms

- **Pre-eclampsia** persistent high blood pressure that develops during pregnancy or the postpartum period and is often associated with high levels of protein in the urine **OR** the new development of decreased blood platelets, trouble with the kidneys or liver, fluid in the lungs, or signs of brain trouble such as seizures and/or visual disturbances (from www.preeclampsia.org).
- **Uterine Didelphys** (or double uterus) a rare congenital abnormality that results from the failure of the Mullerian ducts as a fetus. A double uterus may have one opening (cervix) into one vagina, or each uterine cavity may have a cervix. In many cases, a thin wall of tissue runs down the length of the vagina, dividing it into two separate openings. For more information, visit the <u>Mayo Clinic's</u> website.
- **Bakri Balloon** an inflatable device placed into the uterus after delivery with the purpose of eliminating hemorrage (from www.medscape.com)
- **Disseminated intravascular coagulation (DIC)** In some cases, the clotting components of the blood cause blood flow to be restricted to organs. In other cases, the clotting factor is consumed and serious bleeding occurs.
