#### **OUR MISSION**

To decrease inequities in childbirth by providing access to doula services, childbirth education, and prenatal & postpartum support for low-income and teen families in the Omaha area.

#### **OUR VISION**

We envision a world where all expectant families are guaranteed access to the services, support, and education needed to set them down a path to a safe, informed, and empowered birth experience.

#### **OUR PURPOSE**

Expectant teens and families facing financial insecurity are far less likely to have access to the prenatal and postpartum care, education, and support they may need due to high costs and other associated barriers. Omaha Better Birth Project seeks to break down these barriers so ALL families can access the care they may need to have an safe, informed, and empowered birth & postpartum experience.

#### **BIRTH DOULA GRANTS PROGRAM**

Omaha Better Birth Project believes a family's income should not be a barrier to accessing essential childbirth services, including doulas. We help eliminate this barrier by providing grants to low-income and teen families for birth doula services.

In January of 2022 we launched our Birth Doula Grants. Through this program, 19 families were able to welcome their babies earth side with the essential support of a doula.

#### FRESH START DIAPER PROGRAM

The Fresh Start Diaper Program provides low-income and/or teen families with monthly supplemental diapers and wipes. Thanks to a generous contribution from Molina Cares, we were able to double the impact of this program. In 2022, the Fresh Start Diaper Program grew more than 3.5 fold, from 37 families in January to 138 families in December.




